# Congressional Voting Record

As of April 2018

## 115th Congress

This voting record reports on legislative votes taken by members of Congress during the 115th Congress (2017-2018), to date. The votes lawmakers take have real-life consequences for people struggling with hunger and poverty in the United States and around the world.

During the 115th Congress, Bread for the World has urged lawmakers to support legislation and policies that put us on track to end hunger by 2030, including:

- Reducing the impact of taxes on low-income households and expanding the child tax credit.
- Fully funding domestic and international programs in the 2017 and 2018 U.S. federal budgets.
- Protecting low-income families access to Medicaid.
- Providing additional funding to address the near famines in northern Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan, and Syria.
- Protecting immigrant families and giving Dreamers a pathway to citizenship.

## Senate Legislation

### Budget & Tax

1. **The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (H.R. 1)** cut taxes for individuals and corporations and will add at least \$1.5 trillion to the federal deficit. The tax cuts passed in this bill, which largely benefit high-income individuals and large corporations, could potentially lead to deep cuts in Medicaid, SNAP, and other safety-net programs that help people experiencing hunger. This bill also repealed the individual mandate in the Affordable Care Act. Without the mandate, 5 million of the most vulnerable Americans could lose their Medicaid coverage. Bread for the World opposed this legislation and encour-

aged all members of Congress to vote no. The bill passed the House by a vote of 224-201 and the Senate by a vote of [51-48](#), and was signed into law by the president.

2. **The Bipartisan Budget Act (H.R. 1892)** lifts spending caps for the next two years, allowing non-defense discretionary (NDD) spending to be increased by \$63 billion in fiscal year 2018 and \$68 billion in fiscal year 2019. This allows for possible funding increases to programs addressing hunger, malnutrition, and poverty both domestically and internationally in the future. Bread for the World supported this bill and encouraged all members of Congress to vote

yes. This bill passed the Senate by a vote of [71-28](#) and the House by a vote of 240-186, and was signed into law by the president.

- 3. The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2018 (H.R.1625)** rejected deep and disproportionate cuts to lifesaving programs by sustaining, and in some cases, increasing funding for core domestic and international anti-poverty programs. Bread for the World supported this bill and encouraged all members of Congress to vote yes. This bill passed the Senate by a vote of [65-32](#) and the House by a vote of 266-150, and was signed into law by the president.

## Medicaid

- 4. The Better Care Reconciliation Act (AHCA Amendment: S.Amdt. 270 to S.Amdt. 267 to H.R. 1628)** proposed the repeal of the Affordable Care Act, restructured and cut Medicaid by over \$750 billion, and would have led to 15 million people losing Medicaid by 2026. Bread for the World opposed this legislation and encouraged all members to vote no. This bill was not approved by the Senate by a vote of [43-57](#).
- 5. McConnell Amdt. No. 667 (“Skinny” Repeal)** proposed the repeal of the Affordable Care Act without offering a replacement. If passed, this would have caused 16 million more Americans to become uninsured by 2026. This was the most consequential vote of the many attempts to repeal the Affordable Care Act and restructure Medicaid in 2017. Bread for the World opposed this legislation and encouraged all senators to vote no. This bill was not approved in the Senate by a vote of [49-51](#).

## International Hunger and Nutrition

- 6. Motion to Table the Paul Amendment.** When a fiscal year 2018 spending bill was under consideration by the Senate, Sen. Rand Paul (R-KY) offered an amendment to offset the Hurricane relief funding by slashing the United States Agency for International Development’s (USAID) budget and cutting international poverty-focused assistance accounts by more than \$15 billion. The Senate voted on a motion to table the amendment, in which a “yes” vote amounted to opposition to the amendment. Bread for the World supported the vote on the motion to table the amendment and encouraged all senators to vote yes. The motion to table the amendment was agreed to by a vote of [87-10](#).

- 7. Fiscal Year 2017 Omnibus Appropriations and Famine Relief Funding (H.R. 244)** provided \$54.8 billion for the International Affairs Budget, including poverty-focused development and humanitarian accounts. The bill included an additional \$990 million specifically for famine relief. Bread for the World supported this bill and encouraged all members of Congress to vote yes. The bill passed the House by a vote of 309-118 and the Senate by a vote of [79-18](#), and was signed into law by the president.

## Immigration

- 8. The USA Act (Coons-McCain S.Amdt. 1955)** provided Dreamers with a pathway to citizenship and encouraged prioritization of funding to address the push factors of migration from Central America, while also addressing data-driven border security through a comprehensive mile by mile analysis of what security is needed on the border. Bread for the World and other faith organizations supported this bipartisan, bicameral compromise piece of legislation and encouraged all members to co-sponsor and pass this legislation. The USA Act amendment failed to pass the Senate by a vote of [52-47](#).
- 9. The Immigration Security and Opportunity Act (Rounds-King (Schumer) S. Amdt. 1958)** provided a pathway to citizenship for Dreamers but limited Dreamers from sponsoring their parents. Bread for the World urged Senators to vote in favor of this amendment. The legislation failed to pass the Senate by a vote of [54-45](#).
- 10. The Secure and Succeed Act (Grassley S. Amdt. 1959)** dismantled access to family reunification visas, which would have resulted in the separating of immigrant families, would have spent \$25 billion on border enforcement without a proper analysis of the needs of border communities, eliminated the diversity visa lottery system, and jeopardized access to asylum for children and victims of human trafficking. While the amendment offered a 12-year pathway to citizenship for Dreamers, its mandates would have resulted in the immediate deportation of Dreamers seeking citizenship through that path. Bread for the World opposed this amendment and encouraged all members of Congress to vote no. The legislation failed to pass the Senate by a vote of [39-60](#).

## Medicaid

4. **American Health Care Act of 2017 (H.R. 1628)** would have repealed the Affordable Care Act, block granted and deeply cut Medicaid by over \$830 billion, and caused 14 million people to lose Medicaid by 2026. Bread for the World opposed this legislation and encouraged all members of Congress to vote no. This bill passed the House by a vote of [217-213](#), but the Senate did not take up the bill.

## International Hunger and Nutrition

5. **Fiscal Year 2017 Omnibus Appropriations and Famine Relief Funding (H.R.244)** provided \$54.8 billion for the International Affairs Budget, including poverty focused development and humanitarian accounts. The bill included an additional \$990 million specifically for famine relief. Bread for the World supported this bill and encouraged all members of Congress to vote yes. The bill passed the House by a vote of [309-118](#) and the Senate by a vote of 79-18, and was signed into law by the president.
6. **The Grothman (R-WI) Amendment** to the fiscal year 2018 State-Foreign Operations (SFOPS) spending bill would have cut the overall funding for the international foreign assistance account, including funding for poverty-focused development and humanitarian programs. Bread for the World opposed this amendment and encouraged all members of Congress to vote no. The amendment failed [105-307](#).
